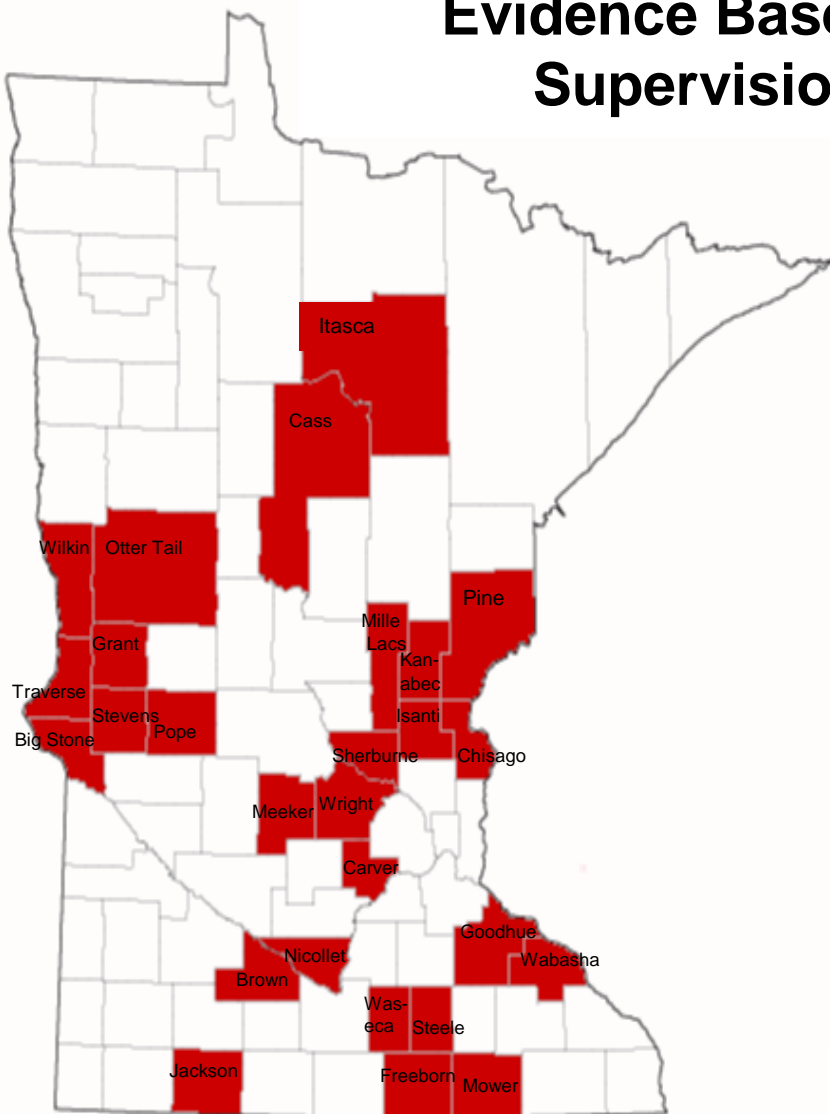

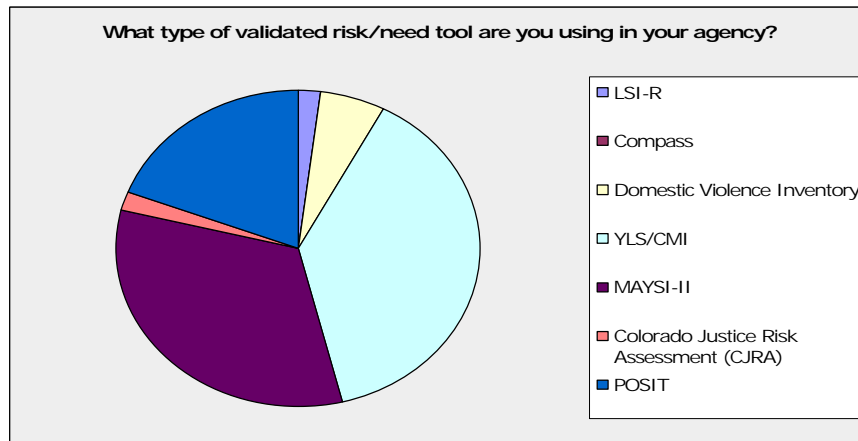

Juveniles- 74% or 20 out of 27 counties use YLS/CMI

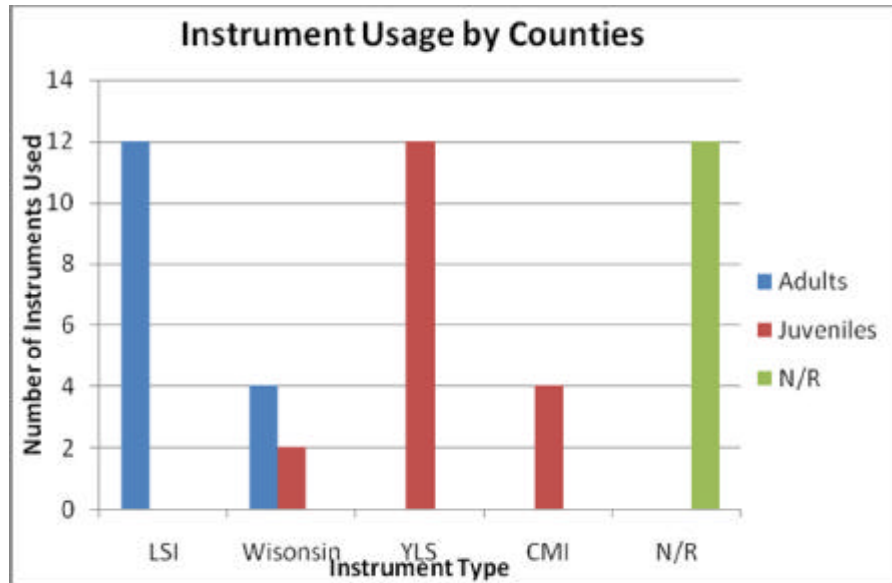

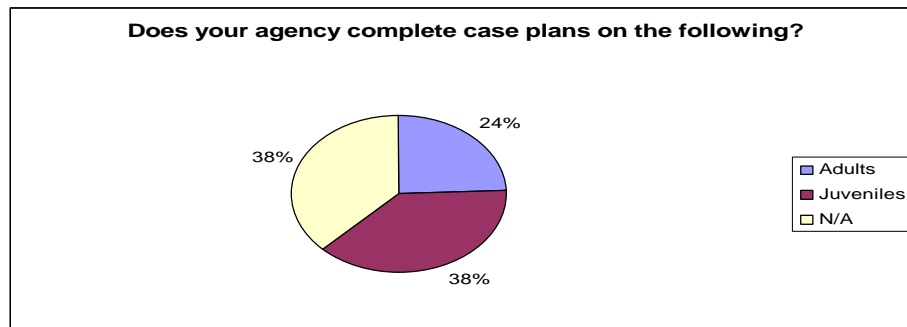

6. If utilizing case plans, what do counties most often use?

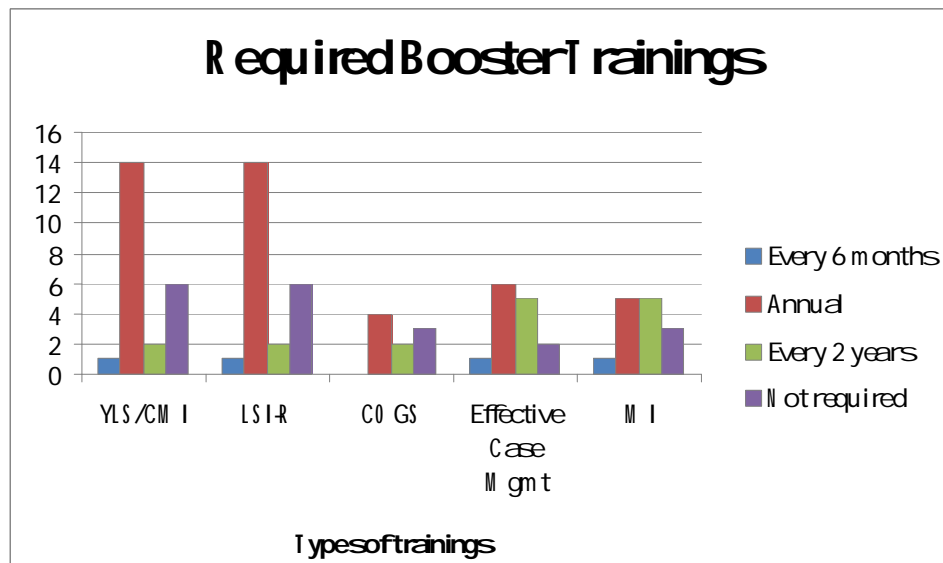

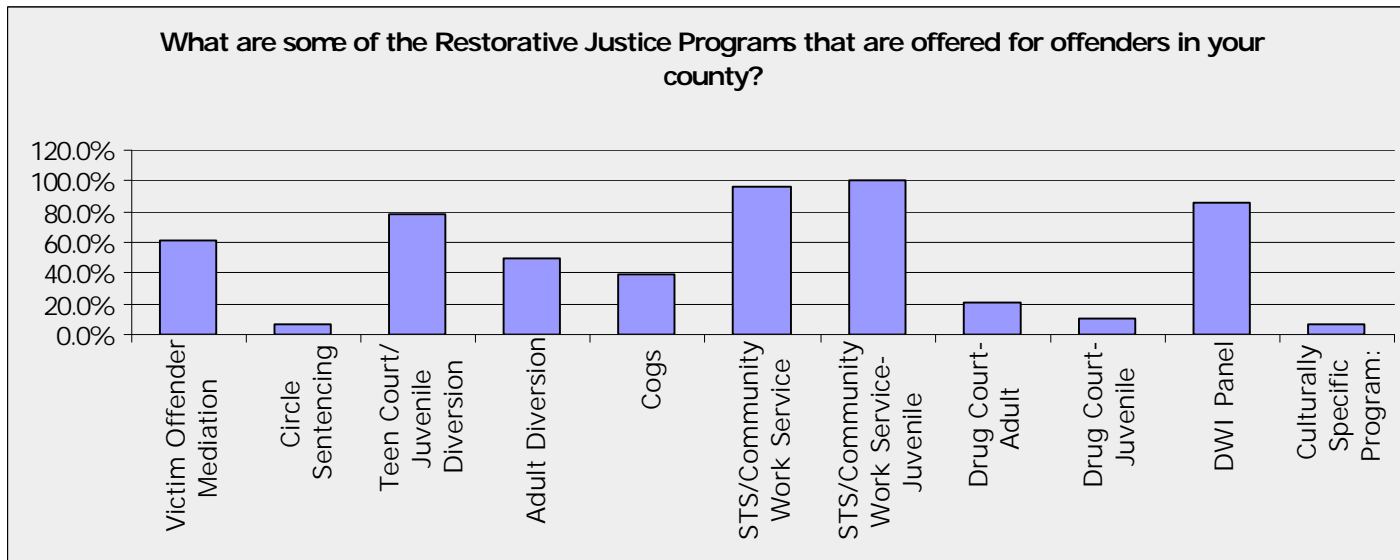
9. Are agencies using positive reinforcement?
